**6:00 p.m.** Meeting called to order by Lt. I. Hernandez. All attendees rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

CDR Zarur took over and advised the MV is 10% less in crime – Crime has been dropping for the last 7 years due to having the “right people in place” and “quality work being done by our MV officers.”

- He asked for help from the public – any suspicious activity needs to be reported and, who knows, it may lead to solving a crime.
- Traffic enforcement is a priority at the Mission Valley.
- Starting to videotape incidents, especially family violence cases.
- 29 schools in the Mission Valley area – 4 traffic units on patrol at any one time.
- Graffiti handled ASAP.
- Military working with EPPD and we maintain a good working relationship.
- Gave advise as to how to handle/react to loud noises outside at night – it is safer to stay inside and call the police.
- Received input from audience reference different topics of interest, specifically of a public safety factor.
- CDR Zarur spoke about the Police Foundation and gave a brief introduction on the purpose of the foundation such as, helping the EPPD with purchasing items, they're a non-profit organization and have provided tracking devices, pole cameras, incentive awards, vests (to include for K-9s), SWAT equipment, help the Explorers. Also noted that the Police Foundation is made up of volunteers and members of the community and covered details of contributing to the Foundation to include guidelines, approvals, etc.
