Presentation by The Hub of Human Innovation on their Annual Report (September 1, 2018 – August 31, 2019), on their progress with respect to the FY 2019 performance measures, as described under the reporting metrics in the Chapter 380 grant agreement. BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION:

On August 9 2011, city council approved a grant agreement between the City of El Paso and The Hub of Human Innovation. The purpose of the agreement was for the creation of a Technology Incubator, which would increase economic development in the City; by encouraging its clients to create jobs, make investments, and improve the City's ability to provide for the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of El Paso.

A second amendment was approved on August 18, 2015, which extended the Chapter 380 grant agreement 4 more years and incorporated a mid-year report and oral presentation requirement to City Council. The Hub of Human Innovation has completed YEAR 4 of their 4year extension. The amount of \$2,253,247 were reimbursed for costs attributable to work performed from September 2011 thru August 2019.

On an annual basis, the applicant must meet five of five performance metrics:

- 1. New Client Companies per year:
 - a. FY 2019: 10 New Companies
- 2. Min Revenue Source from Operations:
 - a. FY 2019: 12% 16%
- Client Company Compensation:
 - a. FY 2019: \$32,500 \$36,000
- 4. Public Workshops:
 - a. FY 2019: Minimum of four (4) public workshops free and open to the public by year
- Entrepreneur/Innovator-Specific Seminar/Networking Events
 - a. FY 2019: 400
- 6. Directed Skill Development Training
 - a. FY 2019: 115

By presenting to Council the Hub of Human Innovation will be complying with the obligations of applicant listed in the Chapter 380 agreement section 4B Compensation, Reporting and Compliance.






