Amend Title 12 (Vehicles and Traffic), Chapter 12.88 (Schedules), Section 12.88.010 (One-Way Streets), to delete the following location on Ninth Avenue, westbound between Mesa Street and Oregon Street of the El Paso City Code.

BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION:

TxDOT's Loop 375 Border West Expressway Extension Project will provide better connectivity around the city; additional infrastructure to accommodate future growth; congestion relief; improved access to the university; downtown; and medical center; and better incident management and a safer roadway. Work Areas 1 and 2 are currently under construction, and the next phase will include Work Areas 3 and 4: Downtown Loop 375 Reconstruction. Converting a portion of Ninth Avenue from a one-way street to a two-way street will increase traffic circulation in neighborhood to accommodate new traffic patterns implemented by the limited access to the Border Highway.






