Background

- Recognizing the importance of quality early childhood educational experiences to help lowincome children close the school readiness gap, the Texas Legislature in 2003 created the Texas Early Education Model, now known as the Texas School Ready! Project.
- Developed and implemented by the Children's Learning Institute, at the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston

Background

- Based on more than a decade of research on how children learn best
- Independently tested and verified as effective in closing the school readiness gap
- Recognized in national publications and peerreviewed journals



The Texas School Ready! Approach

- Three evidence-based components:
 - 1) Research-based curriculum
 - 2) Technology-driven child progress monitoring
 - 3) Facilitated teacher professional development with mentoring



Impact

- Teachers participating in TSR! increase the use of language building activities and emergent literacy instructional practices with children
- Children participating in TSR! show greater increases in language skills and emergent literacy understanding
