SUBJECT:

An ordinance amending Title 18 (Building and Construction), Chapter 18.18 (Outdoor Lighting Code), Article X (Other Exemptions) to revise and add exemptions related to ornamental lighting elements along certain heritage corridors. The penalty is provided for in Chapter 18.18.400 of the El Paso City Code. (Districts 1 and 8)

BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION:

The proposed ordinance revises and clarifies an existing exemption for lighting along heritage corridors by adding the Kern Place Neighborhood Corridor to the existing El Paso International Airport Corridor. The purpose of the exemption is to allow for ornamental lighting including but not limited to string lights and lighted archways and spires within the public rights-of-way to mark key entrances, gateways and corridors within our community. The existing exemption for the El Paso International Airport Corridor and the added exemption for the Kern Place Neighborhood Corridor are two of the ten neighborhood gateways identified in the Sun City Lights – Heritage Corridors Master Plan.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 18 (BUILDING AND CONSTRUCTION), CHAPTER 18.18 (OUTDOOR LIGHTING CODE), ARTICLE X (OTHER EXEMPTIONS) TO REVISE AND ADD EXEMPTIONS RELATED TO ORNAMENTAL LIGHTING ELEMENTS ALONG CERTAIN HERITAGE CORRIDORS. THE PENALTY IS AS PROVIDED FOR IN CHAPTER 18.18.400 OF THE EL PASO CITY CODE.

WHEREAS, Title 18 (Building and Construction) of the El Paso City Code was adopted to promote the health safety, and general welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, the City recognizes the importance of entrances, gateways, and corridors in identifying destinations and linking key places within our community; and

WHEREAS, exemptions from the outdoor lighting code for decorative elements to identify entrances gateways, and corridors is reasonable and necessary in order to promote the City's long-term vision to have safe and beautiful neighborhoods, a vibrant economy and exceptional recreational and cultural opportunities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That Title 18 (Building and Construction), Chapter 18.18 (Outdoor Lighting Code), Section 18.18.377 (El Paso International Airport Corridor) of the El Paso City Code be amended as follows:

18.18.377 – Heritage Corridors.

Ornamental lighting including but not limited to string lights, lighted archways and spires located within the public rights-of-way for the following heritage corridors are exempt from all requirements of this Chapter:

- 1. El Paso International Airport Corridor which is Airway Boulevard from Interstate 10 to Airport Road;
- 2. Kern Place Neighborhood Corridor which is Cincinnati Avenue which is from North Stanton Street to North Oregon Street; East Glory Road from North Mesa Street to North Oregon Street; and East Baltimore Avenue from North Stanton Street to North Mesa Street.

SECTION 2. Except as expressly herein amended, Title 18 (Building and Construction) of the El Paso City Code shall remain in full force and effect.
