That the City Manager or designee is authorized to submit a grant application for the Local Border Security FY18 to the Office of the Governor's, Homeland Security Grants Division, including all understandings and assurances contained therein; and to accept, reject, alter and/or terminate the grant award; and to accept, reject and/or alter a modified award amount for the purpose of sustaining interagency operations and enhancing local law enforcement patrols to interdict criminal activity.
- 2. That the City Manager or designee be authorized to sign any grant related paperwork, authorize budget transfer and submit any necessary revisions to operational plan.
- 3. That there is no cash match required from the City of El Paso.
- 4. That the El Paso City Council agrees that the existence of an award will not be used to offset or decrease total salaries, expenses and allowances that the City receives or provides to the Police Department at or after the time the grant is awarded.
- 5. That the City Council agrees that, in the event of loss or misuse of the LBSP grant funds, the City of El Paso assures that the grant funds will be returned in full to the Office of the Governor Homeland Security Grant Division.
