- August 21: Council adopts FY 2019 budget and tax rate






FY 2017 – 2018 General Fund Budget (\$ in millions)






Public Safety Investments

- Police Academies
 - Two academies scheduled for next fiscal year with a total of 140 cadets total
 - Collectively bargained pay increases, healthcare, incentives
- Fire Academies
 - One Firefighter academy scheduled for next fiscal year with 30 cadets
 - Two 911 Communicator academies scheduled for next year with 40 trainees total
 - Collectively bargained pay increases, healthcare, incentives

Quality of Life Investments

- City's mission to deliver outstanding services to support a high quality of life
- 60+ bond projects completed (Parks, Libraries, Zoo, Museums)
- \$6.8 million invested in operating and maintenance costs for bond projects (through current budget year)
- Additional amenities (not in QoL bond) for the community, including playground replacements and three spray parks
