Frank Lozano

Frank Lozano was born in June of 1950 in El Paso, Texas, to Efrain and Alicia Lozano. He attended Austin High School and graduated in 1968. Upon graduation, Mr. Lozano attended UTEP majoring in Civil Engineering, after three and a half years he abandoned his studies to provide for his family.

Mr. Lozano lost his sight in 1983 due to severed optical nerves in both eyes. He then began working assembling fishing lures at a local company through the Criss Cole Rehabilitation Center. In 1984 he joined the Coalition of Texans with Disability (1984-1989) and the Disability Rights Texas (formally known as Advocacy Incorporated) from 1985 to 1989 where he was part of the Client Assistance Program (CAP). During his time with Disability Rights Texas he also held a seat on the board as Vice-President and later as President. He became part of ADAPT of Dallas (1985-1989) as a full time organizer and ADAPT of Colorado Spring from 1989 to 1982 as Co-Director. In 1992 he relocated to Las Cruces, New Mexico and begin working with the Center for Independent Living (CIL) as an outreach and advocacy agent traveling to Alamogordo, Deming, T or C, Hatch, New Mexico.

He moved back to El Paso, Texas in 1996 to enroll in UTEP's Social Work program. The following year he joined Desert ADAPT El Paso, where he continues to work as an organizer, back-up attendance and local contact for ADAPT in Texas.
