Bill Rivera is a native born El Paso resident who attended local public schools.

Rivera graduated from the University of Louisville, where he received his B.S. (1953) and his Ph.D.(1962) in Chemistry. From 1956 to 1958 he was employed as a Nuclear Engineer, General Dynamics. From 1962-95, he held academic positions ranging from Assistant Professor of Chemistry to Assistant to the Vice President for Academic Affairs at the University of Texas at El Paso. He served twice as President of the UTEP faculty.
