112 Quality of Life projects completed to date. \$56.6 M in work contracted in FY2020 (thru Q2)







Key Opportunities/Challenges

Department	Response to COVID-19
Library	Adjusted programming and service delivery to see increase in digital services usage. Creative online programming. Decrease in visitation and traditional materials circulation
MCAD	Three museum facilities and the Cultural Affairs office were mobilized within hours to safely send employees to begin working remotely. Staff is working to increase social media engagement to stay connected with the public and deliver digital arts and cultural programming at no cost to the public
Parks	Closure of facilities and cancelation of structured recreation/programs has significantly impacted revenue and attendance
Ζοο	Zoo's closing has dramatically impacted the revenue it receives from operations. Impacting attendance, programming, events, private catered rental, concessionaire revenue and Zoological Society income
