AGREEMENT 2016 AUG 16 PM 12: 24

This Agreement is entered into by and between the City of El Paso, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Texas, hereinafter referred to as the "City," and Pablo Lopez, individually and on behalf of the Southside Neighborhood Association, hereinafter referred to as the "Association".

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Association is planning the Segundo Barrio Community Block Party, a community event that will be held on September 4, 2016 ("Community Event");

WHEREAS, the Community Event will provide entertainment to citizens in El Paso, and it is the type of event that will foster community pride, encourage civic engagement and celebrate the heritage and culture of one of the oldest neighborhoods in El Paso's history;

WHEREAS, the Association has inadequate funding available to fully pay the costs of holding the Community Event;

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the provision of funding to be used for the holding of the Community Event helps to foster community pride, encourage civic engagement and celebrates the heritage and culture of one of the oldest neighborhoods in El Paso's history constitutes an important municipal purpose or benefit to the City and citizens of El Paso for which the City is willing to expend the funds designated in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement provides for funding and payment for costs related the holding of the Community Event and the costs and expenses covered pursuant to this Agreement are not addressed or covered by any other agreement between the Association and the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and mutual agreements hereinafter set forth, the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

1. **DURATION AND SCOPE.** The Association agrees that in conjunction with the presentation of the Community Event, the Association shall utilize the funding provided under this Agreement for purposes of the Community Event to benefit the citizens of El Paso and to persons in areas located near El Paso. In promoting the Community Event, from the effective date of this Agreement through September 4, 2016, the Association shall recognize that the City of El Paso has contributed funding for the Community the Event.

2. **CONSIDERATION.** The City shall provide monetary support in the total amount of Two Thousand Five Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$2,500.00) to the Association available from the discretionary funds from City Council Representative District 8, to be used towards the holding of the Community Event. Such funds shall be paid by the City to the Association on

August 23, 2016. Within five (5) days after completion of the Community Event, the Association shall provide reasonable proof of the expenditure of such amounts in the form of receipts, purchase orders or other documents which reflect payments equal to the sum requested.

In the event that the Association does not hold the Community Event, the Community Event is cancelled, or the Association does not provide reasonable proof of the expenditure of the funds equal to the monies paid by the City to the Association, the Association will reimburse the City for the funds paid by the City under this Agreement.

3. **LEGAL RELATIONSHIP.** Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as creating a legal relationship of co-sponsorship of the Community Event by the City or responsibility for the Association and any organization involved in the presentation of the Community Event. The Association is an independent contractor, and nothing herein shall be construed as creating the relationship of employer and employee or principal and agent between the parties.

4. **INDEMNIFICATION.** As a condition of the granting of this Agreement, **THE ASSOCIATION AGREES TO INDEMNIFY, DEFEND AND HOLD THE CITY, ITS OFFICERS, AGENTS AND EMPLOYEES, HARMLESS FOR AND AGAINST ANY AND ALL CLAIMS, CAUSES OF ACTION, LIABILITY, DAMAGES OR EXPENSE, (INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ATTORNEY FEES AND COSTS) FROM ANY DAMAGE TO OR LOSS OF ANY PROPERTY, OR ANY ILLNESS, INJURY, PHYSICAL OR MENTAL IMPAIRMENT, LOSS OF SERVICES, OR DEATH TO ANY PERSON ARISING OUT OF OR RELATED TO THIS AGREEMENT OR THE COMMUNITY EVENT.** Without modifying the conditions precedent for preserving defenses, asserting claims or enforcing any legal liability against the City as required by the City Charter or any law, the City will promptly forward to the Association every demand, note, summons or other process received by the City in any claim or legal proceeding contemplated herein. The Association will 1) investigate or cause the investigation of accidents or occurrences involving such injuries or damages; 2) negotiate or cause to be negotiated the claim as the Association may deem expedient; and 3) defend or cause to be defended on behalf of the City all suits for damages even if groundless, false or fraudulent, brought because of such injuries or damages. The Association will pay all judgments in actions defended by the Association pursuant to this section along with all attorneys' fees and costs incurred by the City including interest accruing to the date of payment by the Association, and premiums on any appeal bonds. The City, at its election will have the right to participate in any such negotiations or legal proceedings to the extent of its interest. The City will not be responsible for any loss of or damage to the Association's property from any cause.

5. **SAFETY.** The Association shall comply with all applicable laws, ordinances and regulations.

6. **DISCRIMINATION.** The Association, its officers, agents, servants, employees, volunteers and third parties will not discriminate on account of race, color, religion, sex or

national origin, nor will it permit or allow any discrimination in the work done pursuant to this Agreement.

7. **NON-RELIGIOUS ACTIVITIES.** The Association will conduct the Community Event, insofar as it may involve the City of El Paso, in a manner that is exclusively non-religious in nature and scope; there will be no religious services, proselytizing, instruction, or any other religious influences in connection with the group insofar as it may involve the City of El Paso. The Association shall not represent that the City of El Paso is in support of or in favor of any religious services, proselytizing, instruction, or any other religious influences.

8. **HANDICAPPED ACCESSIBILITY STANDARDS.** The Association agrees that in the performance of this Agreement, it will comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act ("ADA"), as may be required by law. The Association, if required, must file the Assurance required under City Ordinance No. 9779, prohibiting discrimination against disabled persons.

9. **COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS.** The Association shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations; all City ordinances and all codes and regulations. Failure to do so in a manner which materially impairs the quality of performance hereunder or affects the administration of the funds provided hereunder shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement.

10. **TERMINATION.** Either party may terminate this Agreement by sending written notice to the other if the other is in default in a matter of serious importance to the aggrieved party. In the event that this Agreement is terminated prior to the holding of the Community Event, the City shall be excused from making any payments pursuant to this agreement.

11. **SEVERABILITY.** Every provision of this Agreement is intended to be severable. If any term or provision hereof is illegal or invalid for any reason whatsoever, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the Agreement.

12. **NOTICES.** All notices and communications under this Agreement shall be either hand-delivered or mailed, postage prepaid in the United States Postal Services, to the respective parties at the respective addresses shown below, unless and until either party is otherwise notified in writing:
