What is a

Transportation Network Company (TNC)?

- A company that uses an online-enabled platform to connect passengers with drivers using their personal or non-commercial Vehicles.
- Examples include:
 - Lyft,
 - Uber X,
 - Sidecar,
 - Wingz,
 - Summon
 - Haxi

Why Revise the Taxicab Ordinance?

- Has not been Revised since 1997
- Is Onerous & Outdated
- Does Not Allow Transportation Network Companies (TNC) to Operate Legally in the El Paso City Limits
- Does not Provide for Fair Competition & Regulation for Both Taxicabs & TNCs
- Does Not Address Current Technology that can be utilized by transportation companies

Proposed Recommendations

- Direct City Manager to Direct Staff to Review the Taxicab Ordinance & Revise As Needed or Provide for a New Ordinance that Will allow TNC's to Operate Legally in the City of El Paso
- Remove Outdated language that no longer applies
- Remove over extensive requirements
- Ensure Compliance with Accommodating Disabled Persons

- Hold Meetings with Taxicab Companies
- Hold Meetings with TNC's
- Hold Meetings with Other Vehicles for Hire if Necessary
- Review other Texas City Taxicab/TNC
 Ordinances For Reference
- Re-Draft the Taxicab or Draft a New Ordinance by the End of Dec 2015
