

Supporting Documentation

Ms. Sylvia A. Carreon is a 76 year old mother of five children, grandmother to 11 children and great-grandmother to three boys and one girl. She is a graduate of Bel Air High School, class of '62, graduated with honors as MVP in sports and Drill Instructor in ROTC. She worked at various jobs before becoming a Detention Officer with the County of El Paso in 1983. She was sworn in as Deputy Sheriff in 1991 at the age of 47 by Sheriff Leo Samaniego, becoming the oldest female to graduate a Sheriff's Police Academy in the state of Texas. During her time with the Sheriff's Department, she received numerous recognitions as a Detention Officer as well as various recognitions as a patrol woman in the field, courthouse and schools.

In 1988, she began coaching the Lady Longhorns of El Paso, Texas with her teams competing in City League. She recruited girls from most elementary schools in her area and later from middle schools. She took her teams to compete in many out of town tournaments in the Southwest area. Lady Longhorns teams competed in the Las Vegas Easter Classic for 9 years, exposing its members to teams from the entire nation. Many of the girls she trained went on to become MVP's in their high school with several receiving scholarships to Division I and Division II colleges in the Southwest. In 2006, she and her brother, Eddie Aguilar, a boys basketball coach, applied and received a status of 501 (c)(3) tax exempt non-profit organization as Longhorn Youth Program of El Paso, Texas. She is the Executive Director and manages all the business of the program. During her years coaching in City League and local tournaments, she was inducted into the Southwest Shootout Hall of Fame in 2002. In 2004 she was recognized by the City of El Paso and inducted into the Chelio Acosta Sports Hall of Fame.

In 2012, Ms. Carreon became self-employed as a DoTERRA Essential Oil consultant and gives health advice over the use of essential oils and their health benefits.

Ms. Carreon became further active in her community by starting the Lomaland Neighborhood Association in 2013 and the Mission Valley Civic Association in 2014. She is president of both associations and has been able to obtain grant funds and bond funds to build a new recreation center at Lomaland Park and massive improvements to E. L. Williams Park as well as Pueblo Viejo Park. She was assigned to the City Parks Advisory Board in 2013 by then Rep. L. Limon and will continue to serve until 2021 under current Rep. H. Rivera.

Ms. Carreon has represented the Mission Valley Planning Area for 3 years in the El Paso Neighborhood Coalition Council. She still attends all regular meetings because she feels the unity of all neighborhood associations is important as one voice from the people to issues in city government. As president of the Mission Valley Civic Association, she receives notice of all zoning and rezoning permits put forth to the city and is able to address any contrary issues found in permit requests to the city.



Ms. Carreon also holds a seat on the Project Bravo Board for Central and Eastside areas. Having suffered personal hardships and helping family members and friends through their own hardships, Ms. Carreon knows this is an invaluable service to the community as Project Bravo serves all families in financial/economic stress.

In closing, the recreational center at Lomaland Park should be named "The Sylvia A. Carreon Recreation & Community Center" to honor and reflect the effect Ms. Carreon's sense of community and pride in same has had in improving her community and the surrounding region along with the lives of everyone she has coached, mentored, or served.

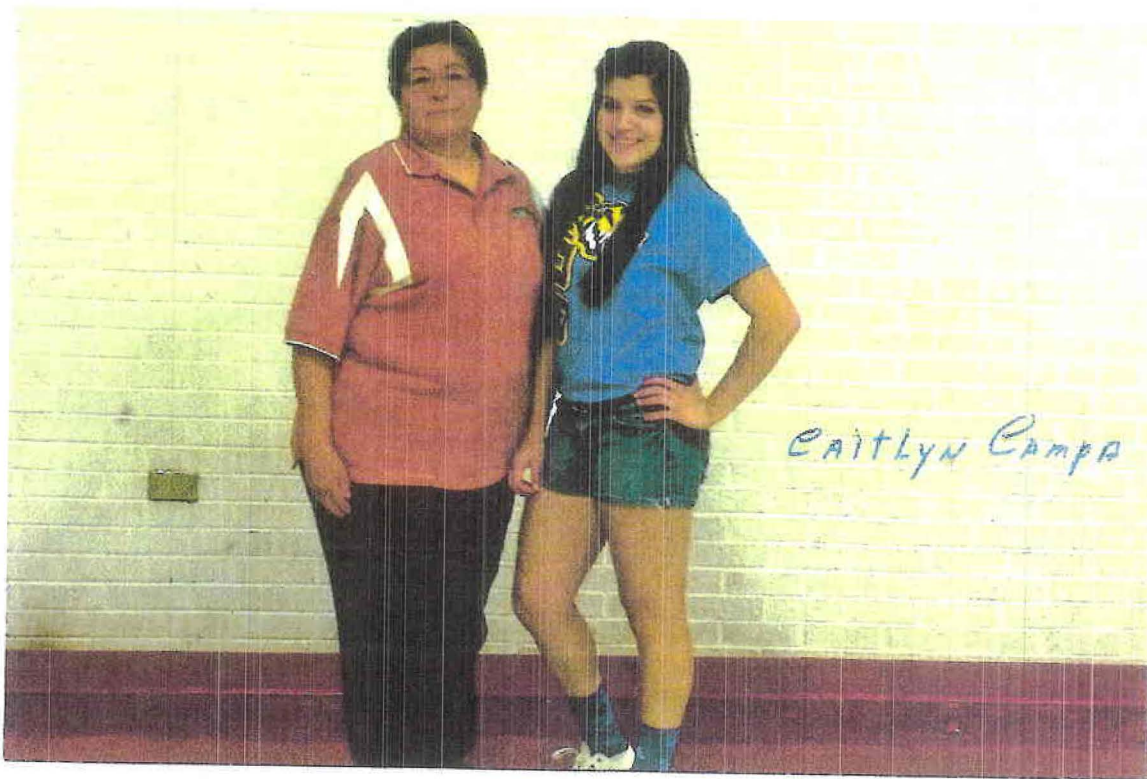

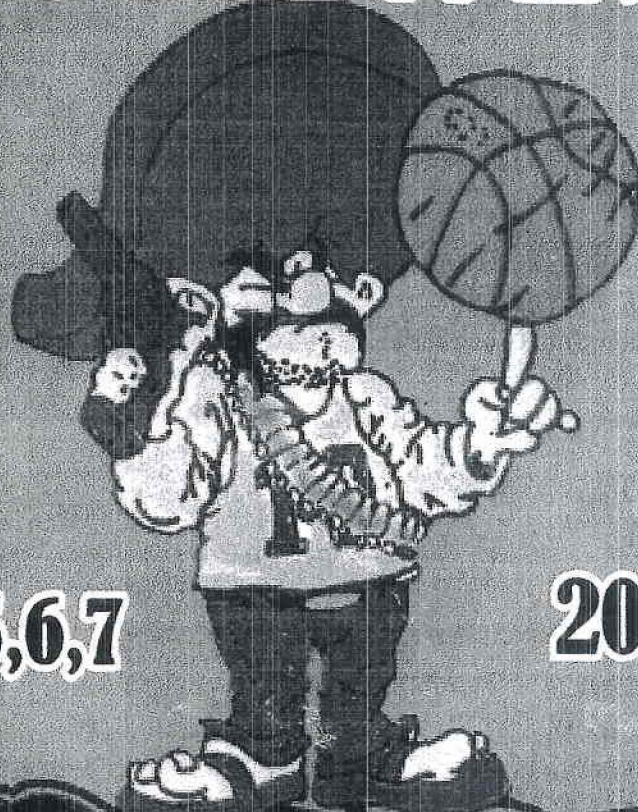

ministrated all Southside sports. He created the Southside T-Bird Association which has raised over \$100,000 to give about kids a chance to play sports. He organized a city program to help hundreds of kids play baseball.

Louie Sanchez started The Northeast Warhawks Youth Sports program 27 years ago, and has provided sports of football, basketball, baseball, cheerleading

and wrestling to boys and girls ages 4-15 years old. The Warhawks football teams have won numerous Little Bowl titles, basketball championships, as well as wrestling. The wrestling team has produced 8 individual state champion folk style and awards and 8 in feestyle wrestling awards.



Manny Frias started coaching baseball in the Summer of 1972. He took a group of young kids from his church, and taught them the game of baseball. For his efforts, the team won the division

and made a decision to help kids the rest of his life. In 1988, he started coaching basketball and began the Westside Sun Devils program in 1991. Among the Sun Devils many awards are placing second place in the March 2000 Southwest Shootout Basketball Tournament.
