### 1. Strategic Goal

Goal 1.6 – Provide business friendly permitting and inspection process



## 2. Consolidated Code Compliance Initiative

- Staff was tasked to review existing code enforcement groups (CEG) within City departments and provide recommendations for inclusion into a code compliance department
- 15 CEG were reviewed and 8 are recommended to be included within a consolidated code compliance department

### 4. Phase I

- 15 identified positions from Planning & Inspections will be transferred to Environmental Services Code Compliance Division on Sept. 1, 2019
- Code officers and inspectors within this team will be identified as the Property Maintenance and Zoning enforcement team (PMZ)
- PMZ will be responsible for enforcing provisions of Titles 5, 9, 18 and 20, and will refer certain cases to the City's Building and Standards Commission (BSC) for enforcement



### 5. Title 5 Revisions

- Title 5 contains 17 chapters that regulate various business licenses and permits
- References are made in these chapters to specific departments, directors and officials to administer and enforce provisions of this title
- In order to accommodate the transfer of PMZ from P&I to ESD, revisions must be made to allow this team to enforce Title 5



## 6. Revision Summary

- Adopt new definition: "City official" any director or official designated by the City Manager to enforce provisions of this Title, which includes but is not limited to a permit official, building official, and fire official
- Where enforcement personnel are referenced, include the terms "peace officer," "code enforcement officer," and "inspector," to allow for any designated person to enforce a particular chapter
- When "Department" is referenced, it relates to administration of a particular chapter
- When "Director" is referenced, it relates to enforcement of a particular chapter
- Streamline appeal process for a denied permit in Chapter 5.01



# 7. Ongoing Code Consolidation Plans

- Locate property/building to house department
- Interview management of CEG to develop schedule to transfer staff to ESD in future fiscal years
- Amend City Charter to create Consolidated Code Compliance Dept.
