# **01** OVERVIEW





- DCHD presents to City Council the 46<sup>th</sup> Year Policies and Procedures to begin the planning process for PY 2020-2021, which begins September 1, 2020
- Staff recommends the following changes be made to its 46<sup>th</sup> Year Policies and Procedures that pertain to its four entitlement grants – CDBG, HOME, ESG + HOPWA
- The proposed changes will ensure that federal funds are utilized and allocated in a way that is strategic and based on community needs.

# **O2** PUBLIC SERVICES

#### **HMIS PARTICIPATION**

 Full organizational HMIS compliance, regardless of program funding source, required for ESG and CDBG funding of services and/or facilities.

#### TECHNICAL ADVISORY REVIEW PANEL

 A Community Development Steering Committee member will be a part of each Technical Advisory Review Panel during the application review process for Public Services under CDBG, ESG and HOPWA.

#### **PUBLIC SERVICES SCORING**

• Applications with a final score of 75% or higher will advance to the oral presentation phase of the grant application process. (70% was the former threshold.).





#### **INCUBATOR PROGRAM**

• Flexibility to use funds for other Public Service proposals if two responsive Incubator projects are not submitted.

#### HOPWA SUBSIDIZED HOUSING

• All HOPWA subsidized housing must be located within El Paso County, including the City of El Paso.





# **03** PUBLIC FACILITIES







### 1. TWO YEAR FUNDING CYCLE

- 46<sup>th</sup> Year to serve as a bridge year to get to a 2-year Large Scale Public Facilities funding cycle.
- Seven remaining projects from 45<sup>th</sup> Year to be re-evaluated for 46<sup>th</sup> Year funding.
- \$1 Million District targeting remains.

(Districts 6 & 7 are targeted Districts for 46<sup>th</sup> Year.)

- 45<sup>th</sup> Year Public Polling Campaign results stand.
- Re-evaluation by staff and Steering Committee of updated applications for the seven remaining projects.

### 2. SUSTAINABILITY CONSIDERATIONS

Applicants encouraged to utilize LEED standards and Energy Star appliances.
