Discussion and action on a Resolution that City Council approve the Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP) funding awards for 2009-2012, attached as Attachment A; authorizing the City Manager to sign all contracts and documents, and amendments to such contracts, with the agencies approved for 2009-2012 HPRP funding; authorizing the City Manager to sign all Environmental Assessments, Requests for Release of Funds, Certifications and Performance Reports required by HUD for HPRP activities; and authorizing the City Manager to take any actions necessary to accomplish the intent of this resolution upon approval by the City Attorney's Office and Director of Community and Human Development Department.

#### **BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION:**

The Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP) was established by Congress under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 signed by President Obama on February 17, 2009. On May 5, 2009, City Council added a Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP) component to its 2005-2010 Consolidated Plan by amending its 2008-2009 Annual Action Plan to allow the City of El Paso to use CDBG funds specifically designated for HPRP activities to give priority consideration and focus additional federal funds to provide homeless prevention assistance to households who would otherwise become homeless, and to provide assistance to rapidly re-house persons who are homeless as defined by Section 103 of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11302).

There are four types of eligible activities for the HPRP: 1) financial assistance; 2) housing relocation and stabilization services; 3) data collection and evaluation; and (4) administrative costs. HPRP assistance is not intended to provide long-term support for program participants, nor will it be able to address all of the financial and supportive services needs of households that affect housing stability. Rather, assistance will be focused on housing stabilization, linking program participants to community resources and mainstream benefits, and helping them develop a plan for preventing future housing instability.

Effective July 16, 2009, the City of El Paso entered into a grant agreement with HUD for use of the \$3,492,976 in HPRP funds. It's mandated by HUD that all HPRP funds be obligated by September 30, 2009. On July 17, 2009, the City published a Request for Proposal notice in the El Paso Times stating that HPRP application packets would be available from July 20-28, 2009. Mandatory training workshops were held for all HPRP applicants on July 29, 2009. The deadline to receive all HPRP applications and supporting documents was August 13, 2009. The CD Steering Committee reviewed all proposals on August 27, 2009, and unanimously recommended the budget specified in Attachment A. CD staff concurs with this recommendation. After this item is approved by City Council, the City will enter into contractual agreements, no later than September 30, 2009, with the agencies identified in Attachment A for utilization of the HPRP funds for a three-year period ending July 16, 2012.

As previously stated, on May 5, 2009, City Council added the HPRP component to its Annual Action Plan and its 5-year Consolidated Plan, clearing the way for utilization of the \$3,492,976 in HPRP funding.

\$3,492,976 will be made available to the City of El Paso from HUD for HPRP funding on a reimbursement basis. Budget transfers to appropriate the funds will be required.
