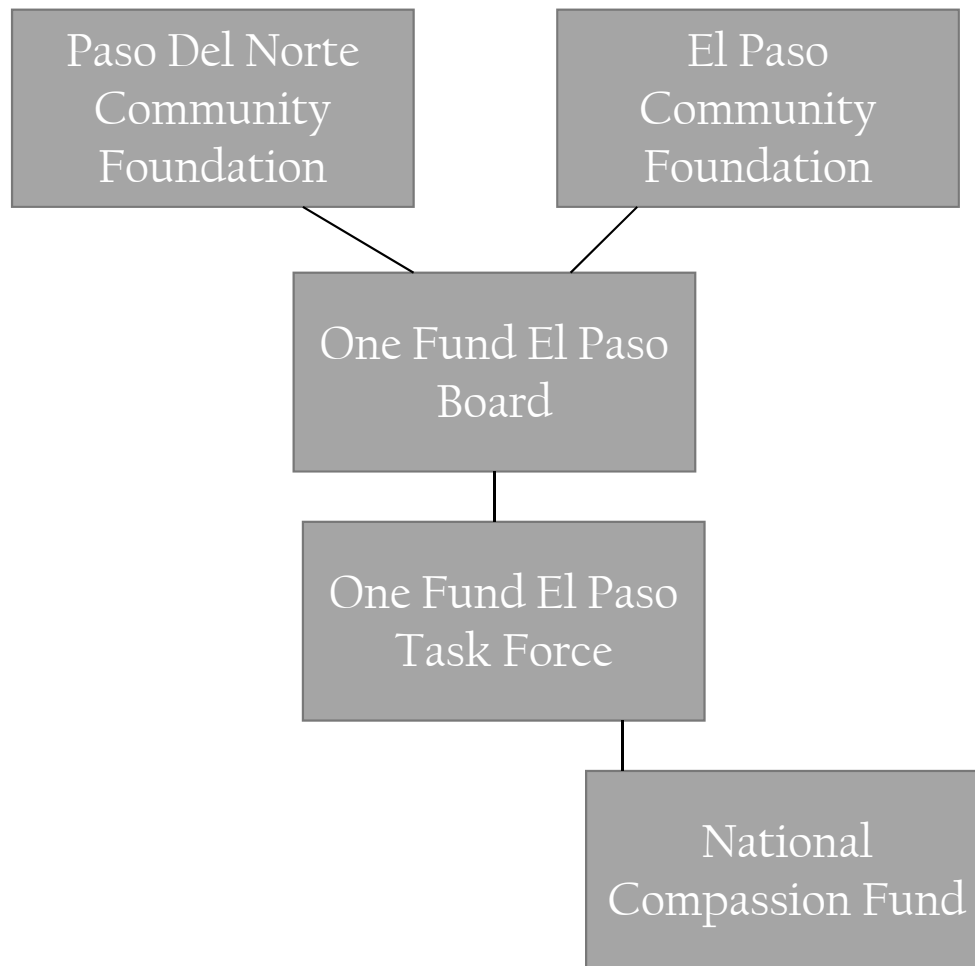

# ONE FUND EL PASO: Draft Protocols

## Categories of eligible applicants:

- Deceased victims killed as a result of the attack;
- Individuals who were physically injured and hospitalized for one or more nights;
- Individuals who were physically injured and received medical treatment on an out-patient basis; and
- Individuals who witnessed the attack or its aftermath, and who experienced psychological trauma which lead them to seek ongoing mental health treatment

- Walmart & Walmart parking lot
- Sam's Club, Sam's parking lot

# ONE FUND EL PASO: Timeline

## August 2019:

- Shooting occurred
- One Fund Task Force Meeting
- One Fund Task Force Meeting with National Compassion Fund

## September 2019

- 5<sup>th</sup> – 26<sup>th</sup>: Draft Protocols put out for public comment
- 26<sup>th</sup>: Community Town Hall
- 27<sup>th</sup>: Board/Task Force to determine final protocols

## October 2019

- 10<sup>th</sup>: Application process begins

## November 2019

- 8<sup>th</sup>: Close of application period
- All month: Validation of applications
- 25<sup>th</sup>: End of donation period

## December 2019

- 11<sup>th</sup>: Board/Task Force determine final distribution plan
- 16<sup>th</sup>: Distributions begin

## January 2020

- Independent Audit begins
