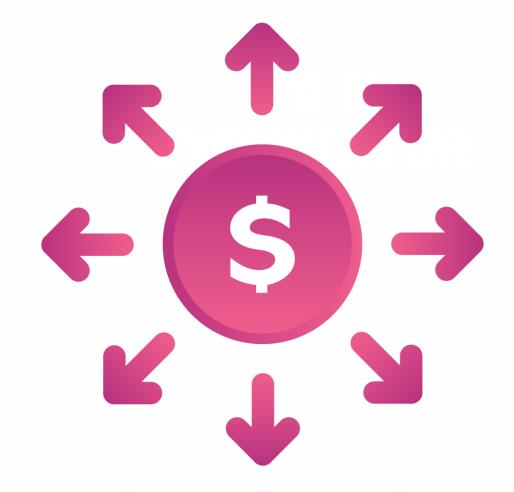

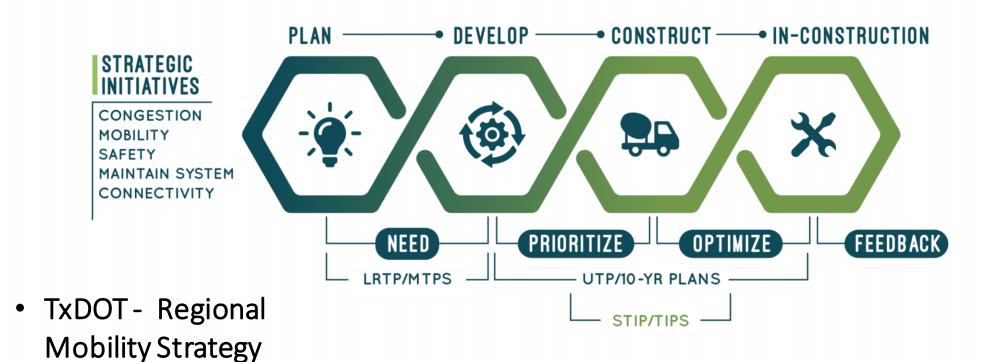

Project consists of extending Sean Haggerty Blvd. from Aaron St. to Dyer St. Includes design and construction of a bridge over the Green Belt Levee, driving lanes, raised median, shoulder lanes and hike and bike lanes.





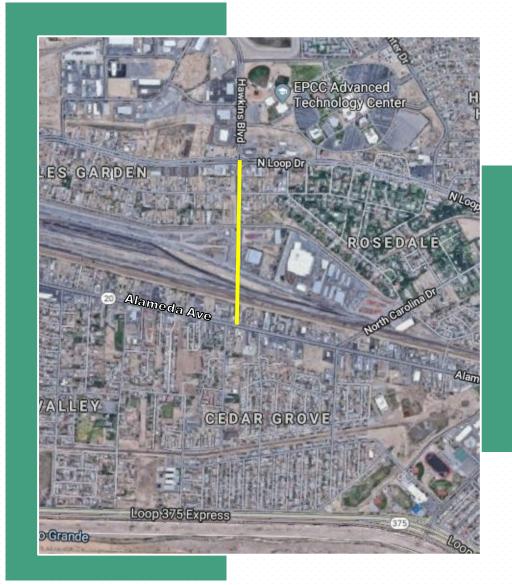
Rojas Widening

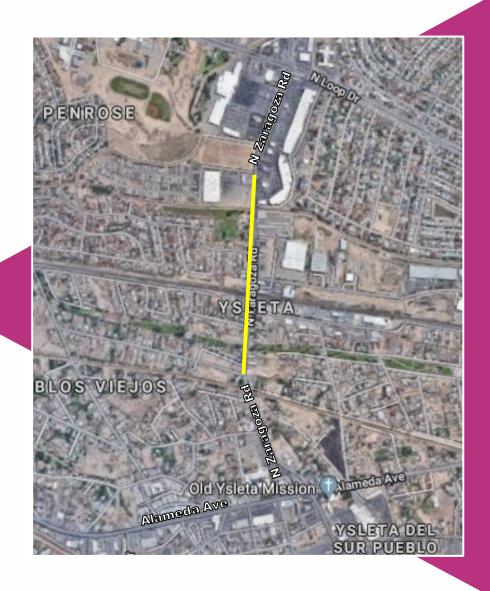
Hawkins Extension

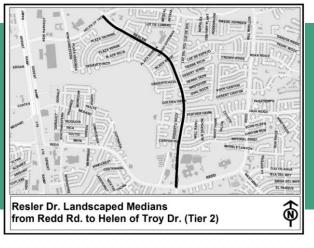










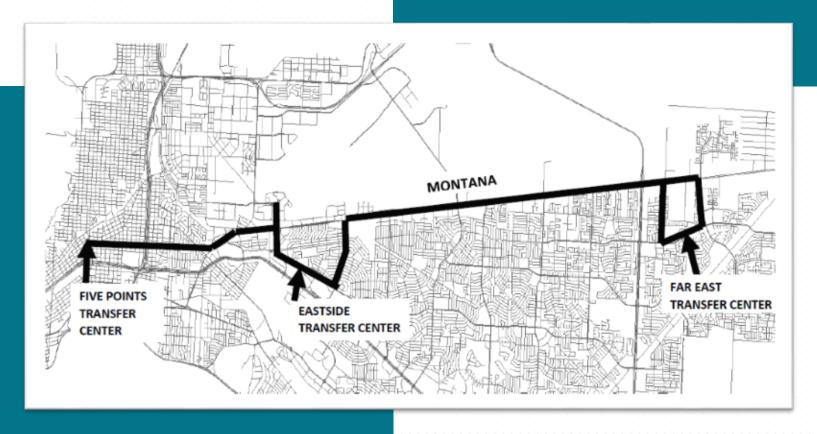


Montana RTS
