
NEIGHBORHOOD CHARACTER: The subject street is located within the Downtown Historic district between the Santa Fe and El Paso rights-of-way.



El Paso Water

El Paso Water (EPWater) does not objects to this request.

EPWater requests a copy of the official street name change to update our records.

Water:

There is an existing 12-inch diameter water main located along of Sheldon Court. This water main is available for service.

Sanitary Sewer:

There is an existing 8-inch diameter sanitary sewer main located along the north side of Sheldon Court. This sanitary sewer main is available for service.

General:

An application for water and sanitary sewer services should be submitted 6 to 8 weeks prior to construction to ensure water for construction work. Additional service applications are available at 1154 Hawkins, 3rd Floor. A site plan, utility plan, grading and drainage plans, landscaping plan, the legal

description of the property, and a certificate-of-compliance are required at the time of application. Service will be provided in accordance with the current EPWU – PSB Rules and Regulations. The applicant is responsible for the costs of any necessary on-site and off-site extensions, relocations or adjustments of water and sanitary sewer lines and appurtenances. Alameda Avenue is a Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) right-of-way. All proposed water and sanitary sewer work to be performed within Alameda Avenue right-of-way requires written permission from TxDOT.
