Program Progress

2017 Status

- \$78.3M committed funds
- \$140.1 balance

2018 Status

- \$131.8M committed funds
- \$86.6M balance

Increase of \$53.5M in committed funds (Additional \$18.6M in bidding)

- 10 Projects Completed
- 33 Active Projects
- 21 Programmed Projects

2018 Status

- 17 Projects Completed
- 47 Active Projects
- O Programmed Projects

Street Improvements

City match funds may range from 5-20% of the overall project cost

 Leverage City funds to provide improvements needed by the community

Design	10	\$28.4M



Street Improvements

Preview of active street improvement projects funded by:

- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
- Other Funding Sources (Capital Plans, etc.)





- Warm and dry weather allowed resurfacing work to start earlier
 101 streets have been resurfaced since February
- Overall, 289 streets completed out of 413
- \$33 million expended out of \$48 million
- All streets from 2012 program are currently under contract

Arterial paving

- McCombs and Railroad substantially complete
- Resler preliminary concrete work underway
- Hawkins milling is in progress

- PCI data presented to City Council in August 2018
- New resurfacing selections based on:
 - PCI data new PCIs drive the selection criteria
 - Utility Clearances streets were vetted with utility partners to ensure no utility issues that could cause the streets to be cut into within the next few years
 - Geographic Locations focus working in neighborhoods, limiting mobilization, and avoiding jumping around the City
 - Streets cross-checked against streets requested in the budget process and streets on the unfunded CIP list

- Warm and dry weather conditions produced less potholes than previous year
 - FY2018 39,376 potholes repaired
 - 3,140 public service requests for potholes. 8.4% of total pothole patching was response to public service requests
- Continue to produce about twice the patching work with the same resources as prior to Lean Six Sigma project in 2014
