Helps move visitors and residents throughout the city and to destinations and attractions to enhance economic impact.


DESIGN INTENTION FOR WAYFINDING


- 1. Consistency with traditional and contemporary design elements
- 2. Integration with existing signage
- 3. Provide orientation with regional color scheme
- 4. Design a structure to minimize the vandalism and allow easier maintenance

WAYFINDING REGIONAL COLOR MAP

Complimentary colors were considered when designating the location of each color system on the map.

As visitors pass from one region to the next, the sign color system establishes strong color differentiation to confirm boundary breaks.



EVOKING THE EL PASO BRAND



On the canvas of its natural environment is the star, embodying the heart of all that the people have created. We see this as an interrelationship in harmony: The land, and its people.



























FEEDBACK RECEIVED: PAC 9-11-18

FEEDBACK RECEIVED

- In general, PAC was in agreement with the concept of wayfinding and color schemes
- Mixed reviews on the pattern
- Recommendation to include natural elements: vegetation, mountain, river, sunset
- Pattern is for effect and did not object to the idea – "Papel Picado" will tie into the existing wayfinding program within the downtown area



FEEDBACK RECEIVED: PAC 9-11-18

FEEDBACK RECEIVED

- Did not encompass the essence of El Paso
- Did not include the River
- Shape of the mountain was too generic
- Not festive enough
- Design was too simple
- Recommended that a competition be held for the development of the logo

RESPONSE TO FEEDBACK

- Can a single sign capture the full essence of El Paso?
- The intent was to develop a simple, metaphorical concept that spoke to the residents based on the feedback for identifying the spirit of El Paso.
- Simple designs are recognizable



- Picado inspired relevant to other existing environmental designs elsewhere in city
- Simple and impactful without need for environment details (mountain/river)
- Still has strong relationship to El Paso star on Franklin mountains













- Picado inspired relevant to other existing environmental designs elsewhere in city
- Classic picado details incorporated. Design mimics realistic cut paper, meaning design can actually be cut through any material.
- Works perfectly with existing citywide color pallet (see right).
- Can be used as actual papel picado decorations

FEEDBACK RECEIVED

- Do Not do a Competition for the City Logo
- Look at using UTEP talent for specific tasks
- Change the font
- Incorporate Native American, Flora and the River into the Logo
- Gateway should have a #Tag
- Simple Design that will not become dated
- Agreed on the color scheme, pattern
- Option 1 and 2 were the better options, but need more work

RECOMMENDATION TO CITY COUNCIL

 Have the Consultant work on the logo and run it through PAC and MCAD board

STAFF ACTIONS

 Consultant developed additional logo concepts to consider and recommend the adopt or use official City Logo

- Star location is truer to landscape








- Evokes cleaner, forward-thinking design appeal

- Design evokes light from mountain star






- Inspired by incorporating Rio Grande with star

- Subtle depiction of classic 'north' map arrows.
































