El Paso Archaeological Society (EPAS)

- 1922: El Paso Archaeological Society (EPAS) established
- 1977: El Paso Museum of Archaeology opened
 - EPAS instrumental in assisting set-up of museum
 - Over past 41 years, EPAS has supported museum as docents and volunteers and through community outreach
- 2018: EPAS is a registered 501(c)(3) organization
 - Current membership: approximately 250 professional and avocational archaeologists, as well as other subject matter enthusiasts
 - Supports museum through:
 - Monthly lecture series hosted at museum
 - Monthly newsletter, which includes promotion of museum and its activities
 - Financial support limited to annual group membership and small support donations

Terms of Mutual Cooperation Agreement

- EPAS will provide support and assistance to the museum including:
 - Provide docents to support museum activities
 - Publish monthly newsletter to include museum information
 - Donate to museum 20% of all proceeds raised at fundraising events conducted at the museum
 - Provide volunteers to support museum events and activities
- EPAS will donate to the museum a subject matter specific collection of books and documents
- Initial term of agreement: 2 years
- City will allow EPAS use of museum's Lab Room to conduct weekly meetings, monthly board meetings and monthly public meetings
- City will allow EPAS use of museum's Auditorium on 3rd Saturday of each month to conduct public lecture series
