BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION:

In November 2012, voters approved two propositions as part of the Quality of Life Bond totaling \$473,250,000. In February 2013, City Council authorized an initial three-year rollout plan for a portion of the Quality of Life projects. We are currently within the third year of that initial plan. City staff is bringing forward a plan for discussion and action that will authorize the allocation of funding for the five-year plan, through 2020, for the Quality of Life Program.








QOL 10 year, Street CIP 12 year (\$ Mil.)






