- 3. Business Items Minutes
 Approval of September 24, 2020 City's Accessibility Advisory Committee minutes.
 Jose makes motion, Charles seconds motion, all in favor, approved unanimously.
- 4. Review of ADA sensitivity training that is provided to the City.

Julio Perez speaks to ADA training being mandatory for anyone and everyone who works for the City of El Paso. This training covers broad spectrum from knowing how to speak to someone with various kinds of different disabilities all the way to how to address service animals. Training presentation is available upon request.

- 5. ADA review of sidewalk and curb cut requirements.
 - Julio Perez speaks to City laws and regulations on sidewalks and cub cuts. Requirement locally falls under abiding property owner not under the City. Meaning sidewalk section belongs to homeowner and may be for public use. When older homes are/were purchased that were built prior to City Ordinance without a sidewalk, the City cannot go back and demand owner to add sidewalk. In those scenarios where there are no sidewalks, there are various methods to be able to add sidewalks. No federal or local law mandates the whole city needs to have sidewalks all over. Law only states City services needs to be accessible. This means there can be a sidewalk nearby or close by but not in a specific location to access.
- 6. District 8 & 1 CDBG funding opportunity.
 Julio speaks to a possible \$500,000 grant for each of the districts for sidewalks and/or curb cuts. It is very competitive so encourages AAC members to reach out to the public to come forward and bring up these issues/areas of opportunities. Ultimately, it comes down to the areas/cities with the most need. Deadline is end of the 2020 year so requests need to be in by end of November.
