2. Approval of Minutes

Discussion and action on the approval of the September 11, 2019 and October 9, 2019 minutes.

Celeste Varela motioned to accept the September 11, 2019 and October 9, 2019 minutes; Dr. Guy Johnsen seconded; all members voted in favor, and motion passed unanimously.

3. Reports-Support the City of El Paso's Initiative to Reach and Sustain a 90% or Greater Live-Release Rate by 2020.

A. Animal Services Center Tour

Paula Powell explained that since all the members have taken the Animal Services Center Tour, she would like to open the tour to the "I will rallies" for any ASAC member.

Julie Rutledge motioned to open the Animal Services tour to the "I will rallies for ASAC members; Dr. Guy Johnsen seconded; all members voted in favor, and motion passed unanimously.

B. Department of Animal Services Center Update on October's statistics
Paula Powell mentioned that she gave a presentation to City Council on November
12, 2019 on Animal Services Center updates. The presentation can be watched online under agenda item 21.1.

The intake for October was 2,206 as the lowest in 30 years, compared to last year's intake at 2,422. The outcome comparatives were at 2,100 compared to 2,374 in 2018 and 2,348 in 2017. Adoptions were lower than last year. The transferred out increased to 361 compared to 316 last year. Animal Services is focusing on the died-in-care. There was a huge decrease in the owner-requested euthanasia with only 7 for October compared to 23 in 2018. The shelter euthanasia also decreased from 329 last year to 189 this year. American Pet's Alive is assisting in creating a training program to help foster care become more successful. There were 741 fosters out. The euthanasia history for October were 7 owner-requested euthanasia, 29 trauma, 39 behavior, 45 non-infectious and 69 infectious. The died-in-care breakdown was 38 in the shelter and 52 in foster care. The LRR for October was 87.18%. The calendar LRR was 86.53% compared to 84.46% last year. The LRR for the fiscal year was at 86.43%. The Animal Shelter Count LRR was 87.18% with euthanasia at 8.57% compared to last year's LRR of 80.83% and euthanasia at 13.58%. The LRR for dogs was 89.11% and 84.40% for cats for October 2019. Ramon Herrera and Michele Anderson presented the PAW Cast. City Council approved the capital plan of 10.9 million for Animal Services. Animal Services opened the Mission Valley Adoption Center at 9068 Socorro Rd. The adoption center is open from Tuesday through Sunday.

5. Main Agenda

A. Promote Education and Engagement in Animal Health and Welfare

A1. Presentation and Humane Society Operations ASAC training
Julie Rutledge explained that the objective of her presentation is to help the
new ASAC members understand the role the El Paso Humane Society plays in
the community. The Humane Society is primarily an adoption agency and they
don't take in found pets, however they do refer the finders to Animal Services.
For the last couple of years, one of their goals has been to transfer 60% of
animals from Animal Services. They have transferred in 65% of animals since
the end of September and 63% year to date. That equates to over 3,200 animals
with 2,000 of those animals transferred from Animal Services. Another goal is
to have 4,200 adoptions a year. They have adopted over 4,000 animals a year
during the last couple of years. The Humane Society mostly transfers in
animals, but has occasionally transferred out to breed specific rescue groups.
In mid-March, they started a 24-hour neonatal kitten nursery. They worked

with Austin Pet's Alive to help with the program. They worked with 700 kittens this year.

At the end of September, the Humane Society had 168 died-in-care which is about 5% of their total intake. As of October, they pulled 84 parvovirus-positive animals from Animal Services in which two were euthanized and thirty-one died-in-care. They only euthanize for illness and behavior. This year 36 were euthanized for illness compared to 74 last year.

Their return rate goal is 8%. This year they are at 7% compared to 8% last year. For the month of September, the return rate was at 5%.

The main objective of the Humane Society is to get animals adopted out as soon as possible. The average stay is about 2 weeks. The staff is focused on finding good adoption matches in order to accomplish the objective.

The Humane Society relies heavily on adoption fees, since the organization is non-profit. They don't receive city, state or federal funding, however they do receive donations, grants and bequests as part of their funding. Adoptions fees cover about 30% of their operational budget. They rely on fund raising a lot. One of the operational challenges they have are the kennel sizes which makes it difficult to transfer in animals of a particular size.

Another challenge for the Humane Society is finding funds to provide more services to the community. Their medical care has increased about a year and a half ago and so has their expenses. PIMA Medical Institute is helping them by providing externships of veterinarian assistants and they are always in need of volunteers. They are open to the public 362 days a year and are closed on Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas. They have 38 staff members and work 365 days a year, 7 days a week, so having volunteers is extremely vital to the organization. Owner requested euthanasia is offered for end of life only. Cremation, communal cremation and disposals are other services the Humane Society offers. They also have a part-time groomer on-site for the shelter. They are also working with Sun City Cats and El Paso TNR on spaying and neutering community cats and are branching out to owned cats. This year, 1,400 community cats, 109 owned cats and 265 cats under 6 months have had surgery through a bequest.

The El Paso Humane Society has been at its present location for over 10 years and became no-kill in early 2010.













El Paso Animal Services, October 2019 — Foster Numbers










El Paso Animal Services, October 2019 — Live Release Rate Comparatives
