Comments from Mr. Smith and Mr. Abeln. Mr. Smith read into the record the three emails he received from the members of the public:

Marshall Carter-Tripp

I may not be able to attend the virtual meeting of the OSAB tomorrow as I have a previous medical engagement.

Therefore I wish to express my total opposition to any proposal to create "recreational activities" in the Palisades, along the lines of the now-banned projects in the Billy Rogers Arroyo Nature Preserve. Recreation in open space properties is certainly possible - walking, hiking, guided hikes to learn about the area, bike riding on specified trails. Building "jumps" and multiple trails is not acceptable...these actions destroy part of the natural open space, and are very disturbing to most recreational users. Not to mention the disturbance to the animals that frequent parts of the Palisades, such as the mule deer. Bicycle jumps and the like should be reserved for city parks, which are not part of the open space master plan.

<u>Dick Tripp</u>

The City has previously declared that they are not responsible for maintaining the trails in the Palisades. Recall several years ago when there was graffiti and the City declared they were not responsible for cleanup.

If the City permits jumps and multiple trails, which already exist, the city must assume responsibility for maintenance and liability for injuries. In particular, none of the trails are designated for bicycles only; therefore they are by default and past practice, for pedestrians as well as cyclists and should be marked as such.

Our home backs on the road/path leading into the center of the Palisades. We see bikes on the trail day and night. We also see people, including families with children, walking up the trails. We can see the far trails across the lower drainage. We have seen families with children on all of them although most people with children stick to the main trail. There are runners, some in groups and others as individuals. Many people walking their dogs. The sign at the entrance has not been maintained and many of the rules are totally ignored. Therefore I have no faith that any rules the City sets forth concerning the jumps or trails come up with be adhered to.

At times several boulderers will show up and walk back along the lower drainage with their bouldering mats and practice bouldering.

If the city is going to allow cyclists to set up jumps in an uncontrolled manner it will prevent many people from enjoying the outdoor life.

The city needs to encourage those police officers who ride bikes to make irregular passes through the trails. I know Border Patrol has bike patrols too but I have never seen any in the Palisades.

I personally favor having the area designated as a nature preserve. The more "improvements" added, the more difficult it is for deer, foxes and other critters to survive in a harsh environment.

Mr. Smith and Dr. Bonart,

As a citizen and a homeowner in the Kern Place area, I am just letting you know that, in my opinion, allowing construction of bike ramps to open space makes it "formerly open space."

The petition from the folks who want to build on our mountain (not our foothills) and Arroyo Park **Nature Preserve** should not be considered. I am a frequent hiker in the area, and I can assure you that mountain bikers have the mountain to use, along with hikers, climbers, runners, and others. Those who want to disrupt what has been, up to now, a shared space, are in the minority of users of the Palisades area, and should not be able to impinge on the rights of the majority of other users, who are there to enjoy the natural space and majesty of the mountain. There is an incredible amount of flora and fauna to protect, and there is a viewscape that needs to be preserved for all.

Mountain bikers are one thing. Ramps and races are another. Those who want to add to the "activities" represent a small faction of people.

Furthermore, any proposed construction of ramps, etc., constitutes a safety and liability issue for the city.

I urge you and the open space advisory board to recommend no additional uses for the Palisades, and to avoid "recreational actions that was previously done [sic] at Bill Rogers Arroyo [sic]."

As I am unable to attend the meeting, I appreciate your consideration of my concerns, and I hope that this will be shared with the OSAB.
